## 4.0 FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Beth addressed AGM and delivered the Director of Finance report noting season highlights including:

- Significant increase in sponsors, donations and grants which is directly attributable to concentrated efforts of Sponsorship Officer (Sarah Bowles) & President (Rob Mason).
  - \$24,982 received from annual sponsors
  - \$23,308 in donations and grants.



- Membership has continued to grow with increases in all categories.
- New \$60 Social membership category introduced.
- Surfguard recorded show there were 190 Junior members and 163 senior members.
- Season started with a boost of \$10,000 from winning 2015 SLSWA Club of the Year
- Bar and servery have now been competed costing approximately \$80,000 as budgeted. This is complimented by the new AV and wifi facilities that have been installed.
- Training costs have increased however some expenses have been recouped from participants (Brenton Rose surf clinics)
- The Club supported surf sports by paying competitors entry fees at Country, State and National Championships
- Investment of \$50,142 worth of assets as outlined in the Financial Report
- Future projects in planning are:
  - Widening of the access ramp
  - Bar stools
  - Possibility of bar railings/ledges
- The Club has outgrown the existing accounting system and moving to the stand alone accounting system of Xero

## DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

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It is that time of year again when we find cause to reflect on the year that has been and all that has been achieved. With a club of our size it is very important we have a dedicated bunch of people who are willing to give up their time to participate in the running of the club. Thank you so much for all you who keep the club running smoothly and for your assistance to the committee and members of our great club.

The Club remains in a strong financial position with \$242,659 in cash and total net assets of \$407,463. This provides assurance and recognition of a strong and healthy club.

Completed financials are attached, with this report.

This year the accounting software systems were upgraded resulting in achieving greater efficiencies in the record keeping. The internal controls exercised and implemented by our club are appropriate and are effective in accounting for all income received and applied. There is a new office base upstairs that has enable a better management flow of information and storage of documents. This office space providing a quiet work area for committee along with the best views in Albany.

From a whole of club perspective, we achieved many great things this year, some of the financial highlights for the 2016-2017 year are as follows.

The club must also thank the Federal Government for the Beach Safety Equipment funding that has directed \$8 million of additional funding over five years to all SLS clubs to purchase vital safety equipment. The club received \$5,000.

Not forgetting the excitement, (almost air guitar) of the Annual Awards 2016 with the club receiving \$3,000 prize money as 2nd place winner of the Lavan Legal Club of Year. Go Albany!

The club also received a new Inflatable Rescue Boat and 2 new rescue boards from SLSWA.

Membership numbers as recorded through Surf Guard for the 2016-2017 year stand at 165 Senior members and 165 Junior members. This year it is notable that there has been an increase in whole of family memberships.

Hiring of the club venue brought in fund to the amount of \$23,916 – an outstanding increase of approximately \$11,000 on the previous year. This is attributed to the growing stature of the club's venue within the community and the excellent venue management directly attributed by Nadine Shepherd and Pat McSweeney.

In other sales areas of the Club being the Bar, Canteen and Uniform shop all produced exceptional results by at least doubling revenue of the previous year. Special thanks to all those who gained their RSA and Approved Managers certificates in order to assist in running and managing the Bar. Thank you to the amazing Mary McSweeney and here wonderful helpers and all that contributed to assisting in the canteen this year. It's no doubt that purchasing a coffee and something yummy from the canteen is guaranteed to be a Sunday pleasure.





Thank you to Narelle McLean for again this season managing the supply and purchase of uniform stocks. It was a big year seeing a huge increase in the variety of clothing and merchandise the club presented to sell at this year's Centenary Country Carnival, this being achieved with the dedicated operations, organisation and support from Jeanne Swarts and Ainslie Mason. With the value of uniform stock and merchandise, it should be noted that there is the possibility of writing down this value as some remaining stock may not realise its cost value.

There are a large number of people to whom I offer thanks and in particular to those who have volunteered in a range of roles throughout the club. I congratulate all of you achieving great things this season no matter what field or reason.

One of the club's financial and management goals for the coming year is to establish sectional budgets in order to plan for future goals and acquisition of club equipment.

Our Club aims to continue to provide a greater focus on the quality and transparency of reporting especially as our club is within the Not-for-Profit sector. The Legislation around Not-for-Profit organisation is changing and our club is ensuring that it exceeds the minimum standards of Governance, Compliance and Financial Reporting.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017**

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The financial statements cover Albany Surf Life Saving Club as an individual entity. Albany Surf Life Saving Club is a Not-For-Profit Association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 1987, which was replaced by The Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA).

**1 Basis of Preparation**

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for the use by the Management Committee. The Management Committee has determined that the club is not a reporting entity.

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA).

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

**2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

**Plant and Equipment**

Plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

**Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

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**Income Tax**

The Club is exempt from income tax under provisions of Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

**Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

**Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated exclusive of GST.

## DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

What a wonderful 2016 – 2017 season we have had on patrols! There are a lot of factors that make a great season. The weather was the best we have had for many seasons with 69 fine days compared to 44 fine days last season, only 25 overcast days compared to 48 and only 1 rainy day compared to 6 last year. It is much nicer to be on patrol when we have great weather!



There were no major incidents or rescues this season which we attributed to our preventative actions. We had 802 preventative actions this season which included warning people about the Rips and where they were situated, swimming in the correct areas (between the flags), warning people about the presence of blue bottles, cobbles and stingers, warning people about dangers of doing back flips off the jetty, handing out sun cream and getting people out of the water after shark detections.

With the introduction of the Shark Enclosure at the end of last season, our numbers on the beach and in the water more than doubled!! In the previous season, we had 8,521 visitors to our beach, this season we had 18,543. It was fantastic to have so many people on the beach, it makes patrols much more enjoyable and interesting when we are busy, it is also great to see Middleton Beach becoming a focal tourist spot once again during the summer. Members of the public often told us they felt much safer with the Shark Enclosure and the great work and presence of the patrols.

One of the best days to show off the work of our patrols was Australia Day which had over 500 people on the beach and in the water. What a great sight that was!!!

There are a lot of people to thank for making our season so successful. Thank you to our wonderful patrolling members, we had a huge contingent of new members this season, with lots of SRC's and Bronzies joining our ranks. We had well over 115 active members, patrolling a total of 2328 hours, ably led by our wonderful Patrol Captains who provide amazing leadership, knowledge, organisational skills and make the patrols fun and relevant. A big thank you to Jeff Medcalf, Jim Morcom, Alex Wells, Rob Lucas, Danni Lynch, Ian Spurgeon and Jo Lucas. A job well done!

Most of our patrolling members do about 25 to 28 hours patrolling hours in a season, there were 3 members who did above and beyond these numbers!!

The top 3 patrolling hours went to:

- 1) Les Paxton 41.8 hours
- 2) Jo Lucas 40.5 hours
- 3) Chris Ficko 38 hours.

Fantastic effort by these 3 members.

Thank you also to Rachael Duffield for being our Radio Officer this season. We received new radios at the start of this season and they were 100% on our least season's radios!! This was in no small part to Rachael's great work in keeping them in tip top condition.





Thank you also to Dora Adeline for being our First Aid Officer. Dora did a great job of keeping our supplies up to date and fully stocked. Well done a great job again this year.

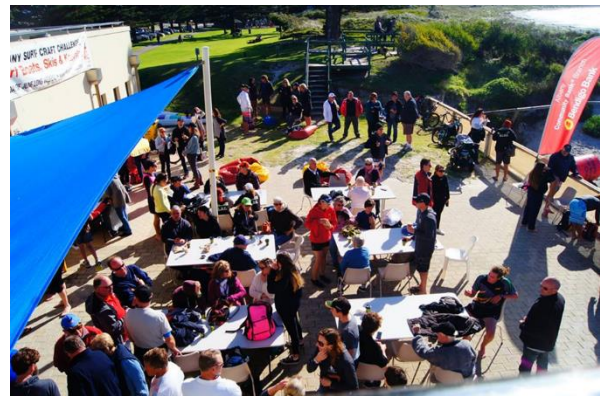
Finally, a big thank you to all members who helped with water safety especially when it was outside of normal patrol hours and raised money for the Club.

## DIRECTOR OF SURF SPORTS REPORT

Each week a number of Surf Sport events were run – especially trying to combine both beach and water events, so as to provide opportunities for new members to become orientated to all the events, as well as allow most of our more specialist Seniors opportunity to share with newer members, as well as train and compete at a club level as preparation for upcoming Country and State events. Again, the willingness and keen engagement of the Senior competitive club members made these events enjoyable within a skills development and competitive environment. This flowed on to our attendance at all State events, not only our home event at Country Carnival, but also in Perth. We had a substantial number of new as well as existing members keen to compete – it showed all other clubs our great club presence and supportive atmosphere wherever we went. Lastly due in part to the club's centenary a Reel and Rescue/Belt Swim was held. This allowed a majority of members to participate in an event of this type for the first time – and feedback on it has been very positive for it to become part of next season's program.



From a Cadet perspective, Carl Richardson has again stood up in his role as Cadet Coordinator. From his perspective feedback on the Cadet group is that the club has such a strong cohort of u14's and Cadets that have a strong commitment to all aspects of the club as evidenced by strong SRC participation, along with Bronze training for cadets. Patrol numbers are swelling with U14's / cadets with an excellent attitude, and the club is going from strength to strength in the continued development and support of recognised activities and cadet roles (such as helping out at various fundraising functions, disco and sleep over, water safety, training, competition, TOAD or Rise Up opportunities.

Of course, none of this would have been possible without the hands-on support of a number of people who need to be thanked. Firstly, the respective Surf Sports Captain's – Dani Lynch for Boats, Rob Slattery for Skis and James Hearle for Boards. This group have been vital in not only managing the ongoing training, budgeting, equipment management, developing the club policies around respective equipment and support for their own sports, but also in help setting the senior program as well as running/scoring each Sunday's events. Their knowledge on the club and events in general as well and their willingness to share and guide me has been great for me to be a part of. Without their help the season itself from my perspective would not have happened, nor have been as well received as it was.

Secondly in regard to the Sunday Handicap Swim I need to thank my co-coordinator – Jim Morcom, again without whose expert advice, experience and willingness to help, this event would not have gotten off the ground and had such a great response. ## DIRECTOR OF YOUTH REPORT

The 2016/17 Season was always going to be a big one for Albany SLSC; and it did not disappoint. As with all the other divisions of the club, the Juniors were kept on their toes and indeed seem to not only take it in their stride, but relish the challenge.

Enrollment numbers of U6-U13 held steady from previous seasons at 157, with another 17 Youth in the U14-15 year age group.

All the favourite events will gain mention here of course. Things kicked straight off in November with Albany hosting the Rainbow Coast Development Weekend at Bremer Bay. Record numbers of attendees, across the 3 South Coastal Clubs, and strong support from SLSWA by way of coaching support meant that Juniors across all levels of ability took something away from the weekend.

The Nippers love an away day, and despite the calendar being fairly well filled we were able to achieve Sunday Activities at both Nanarup and Muttonbird Beach. Keeping these days fixed on the calendar should definitively be a future priority.

Although hosting the Country Carnival represented a huge amount of work for the majority of our senior members our juniors reaped the rewards with an opportunity to compete in a SLSWA carnival at a home beach. 38 Nippers made up this team, for many it was their first carnival.

The enthusiasm for competition seemed to flow on from here with a strong team again heading to Mullaloo for the Country Club Champs. Albany successfully defended the Handicap Pennant making it 2 years in a row.

Again, this successful carnival meant that we had 16 State qualifiers for the U6-U13 of which 15 took up the mantle to represent their club. Fergus Martin winning the U13 Board Paddle broke the gold medal drought. I would like to commend the entire State Team on the way they threw themselves into Individual and Team Events, with sportsmanship, courage and good humour to boot. It was a pleasure to watch. Molly Bowles and Charlotte Musk (U14) attended the Senior State Championships and came home with a Silver Medal in the Surf Team race.

Of course, the competition side of Nipper is one that is easy to measure. Far more telling in the success of the season is I think the more intangible elements.





Strong numbers of smiling Nippers on the beach each Sunday, every week swimming, paddling or running a little further or faster, gaining confidence and improving surf skills and abilities. Tuesday training was again very well attended in both beach and water arenas. Nippers taking their paddling to competition level were worked hard in extra sessions by their coaches and enjoyed success when put to the test.

Four U14's this year attended TOAD Camp on Rottnest Island. I would like to take this opportunity to again thank Carl and the Committee for their willingness to support this Leadership opportunity; it is an extremely worthwhile endeavor. Well done to Soph Adeline, Molly Bowles, Harry Parker-Halstead and Freya Richardson on your selection to attend this camp and your subsequent feedback to the committee and ongoing involvement in leadership roles within the club.

Extra curricular events such as the Christmas Pageant, Country Carnival Movie, Nipper Disco all added to the vibrancy of the season and I'm sure this will mean that we will see many of Nippers return for the 2017/18.

One of difficulties I have found this season has been meeting our officiating requirements at Carnivals. There are several solutions here. A renewed effort in recruiting officials at Club Level - a perfect opportunity for parents who want to be involved in some way but aren't keen on getting in the water. Another solution may be to enter into an arrangement with another club, offering perhaps water safety in lieu of officiating.

I am pleased to report that this season saw 2 more accredited Development Coaches.

The 2018 Country Carnival is to be held at Geraldton. Given this location is 800km away, in order to get good member attendance, it is worth considering a bus and camp style accommodation and making a road trip of the weekend.

In closing my 5th and final Annual Report as Director of Youth I would like to thank the Committee and Andrew Duffield (Sunday Coordinator) for their constant support of the junior program. The younger members of the surf club are indeed our future and it is so heartening to see such enthusiastic support for them. So many people work so hard to make the Season fantastic and I would like to thank each and every one of you for your support. I have learnt so much in the past 5 years and worked alongside so many terrific people. It has been a big job but certainly not a lonely one. It's now time for an injection of fresh ideas as this great club continues from strength to strength.

Next Season will be another biggie, culminating in the National Titles in Scarborough in April 2018.

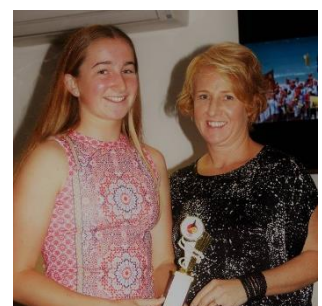
